Farmer Tantoh, founder of SYFA, is working to change that. In 2009, Farmer Tantoh and volunteers installed the first well in Nkambe. With your continued support, more children now have access to safe drinking water.

LANDSCAPING THAT SAVES LIVES

In Mbum land, houses are often made from mud or clay bricks. Without proper landscaping to absorb heavy rains in the summer, erosion will destroy many homes, leaving families without suitable shelter.

One of SYFA's most successful projects is landscaping education and planning, which not only makes homes safer, but encourages biodiversity. As a volunteer or by donating funds to SYFA, you are contributing directly to these efforts.



It takes two weeks to drill a well in Cameroon. Two days to till a garden bed. Two hours to plant a row of flowers. Two seconds to pick up a piece of trash.

The effects, however, last for years.

More than 30 past volunteers who've visited SYFA in Cameroon have planted trees and botanical gardens, established environmental clubs in local schools, drilled low-cost wells, and introduced sustainable farming and landscaping practices.

ABOUT SYFA AND ITS FOUNDER

Save Your Future Association is a non-profit organization in Cameroon, Africa, seeking to promote environmental protection, education, and community relationships. It was founded in 2001 by Dieudonne Tantoh Nforba, a.k.a. "Farmer Tantoh," a native of Cameroon, and officially registered in 2005. The first well was dug in 2009.

Some of SYFA's most prominent goals include collecting and storing precious spring water, conserving natural resources, teaching sustainable agricultural practices to farmers and children, creating environmental clubs, and fostering volunteerism among local residents in Mbum.
